SUNY Chancellor Clifton R. Wharton, Jr. honored CCFL Trustee John C. Britting for his 15 years of distinguished service to the College and the State University, on Saturday, October 9, 1982.

David Frey Appointed Dean of Finance by Trustees

The Community College of the Finger Lakes' Board of Trustees appointed David A. Frey of Rochester to the position of Dean of Financial and Administrative Services in a special meeting, Monday, October 4, 1982.

Mr. Frey's appointment will fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Jerome M. Alvermann, who accepted the position of Vice President for Administration at Mohawk Valley Community College in Utica, NY.

Mr. Frey is currently the Administrator for the Department of Medicine

The ceremony was a central part of the Program conducted for the Association of Boards of Trustees of Community Colleges held in Cooperstown, NY.

Mr. Britting is the first CCFL Trustee to earn the distinction of 15 years of SUNY service. He has served on the CCFL Board of Trustees since his appointment in 1966 by the Ontario County Board of Supervisors. He has since been reappointed for a 9-year term which will expire in 1989. Mr. Britting is the only original CCFL Trustee still serving as an active, continuous member.

During his association with CCFL, Mr. Britting has served two terms as Chairman (1969-70, 1976-78). He currently serves as Chairman of the Personnel/Curriculum Committee.

Mr. Britting is an attorney in Phelps NY and is the Principal of the John C. Britting law firm. He is originally from Williamsville, NY and is a graduate of Cornell University earning his Bachelor of Law degree.

Mr. Frey holds a Master of Business Administration degree in health care management from Cornell University and a Bachelor of Science degree with high honors in finance from Rochester Institute of Technology.
